This is just the tip of the iceberg. It can also scan physical documents into PDF files on your phone. It has many features to improve the scanning process, which helps you to make some clean, clear documents. You can annotate PDFs, share them with anyone, and even fax them for a symbolic fee. The paid route provides additional features such as 10 GB of cloud storage, some editing features, and more. The free version should do well enough for simple things, though. Of course, Word has many other things as well including a text editor, things like resume construction, and more. Additionally, it even has features for reading ebooks and other such PDF use cases. This is a decent all-in-one solution for those who need a PDF reader as well as a text editor. MiXplorer SilverPrice: \$4.49MiXplorer Silver is an all-in-one file explorer. It does all the usual things of a file browser. This includes viewing files, opening different types of files, dealing with archives, and handling most types of media sources.
